9 Delicious Burgundy Values at \$50 or Less

Explore the leading French wine region with new reviews of impressive Chardonnays from Chablis and the Mâconnais, up to 92 points


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Tasting Highlights' wine reviews are fresh out of the tasting room, offering a sneak peek of our editors' most recent ratings—including scores and full tasting notes—to WineSpectator.com members.

It's challenging to find good value in white Burgundy [https://www.winespectator.com/articles/burgundy-s-elegant-2020s-tasting-report-101523], yet this week's lineup of nine white wines offers five bottlings priced \$32 or less. If you are willing to up the ante to \$50, your possibilities broaden, almost doubling the number of labels. And you're just in time to enjoy them during the summer months.

It's also no surprise that Burgundy [https://www.winespectator.com/regions/burgundy] 's best value whites hail from its northern and southern outposts: Chablis [https://www.winespectator.com/regions/chablis] and the Mâconnais [https://www.winespectator.com/regions/maconnais] . I have been urging readers to explore these two areas for the better part of my 20 years as *Wine Spectator*'s lead taster for the region [https://www.winespectator.com/display/bruce-sanderson-decanted] .

The good news is that the 2022 vintage [https://www.winespectator.com/vintage-charts/region/burgundy-white] delivered both quality and quantity. The wines are ripe, but rarely overripe, despite a warm year that also saw adequate rainfall in the spring and again in mid-August. While Chablis and Mâcon whites reveal peach flavors, the latter are distinctively riper and rounder, and the former display telltale flint, chalk dust or stone notes.

Chablis Domaine Long-Depaquit 2022

Score: 90 | \$30

WS review: Displaying lemon, apple and mineral notes, this sleek white shows fine intensity and balance, with a silky texture and a light, chalky feel on the long finish. Drink now through 2027. 14,594 cases made, 2,500 cases imported.—*B.S.*

Mâcon-Milly-Lamartine 2022

Score: 90 | \$28

WS review: A kiss of vanilla weaves throughout the peach, pear and floral aromas and flavors in this delicate, charming white. Lively and lingering, with lemon freshness and a hint of stone. Drink now. 3,365 cases made, 500 cases imported.—*B.S.*

Mâcon-Villages 2022

Score: 88 | \$21

WS review: White flower and peach aromas give way to almond, apple and lemon flavors in this succulent white, which is fleshy midpalate, with a firm, bitter citrus finish. Drink now. 8,600 cases made, 3,600 cases imported.—*B.S.*
