# **Burgundy's Classic 2022s**

Vibrant, balanced Pinot Noirs are the hallmark of the vintage, despite the hot, dry summer

### From the Jul 31, 2025, issue

When I tasted the 2022 red Burgundies from barrel in early 2024, I thought the quality of the vintage appeared promising. Sample after sample revealed ripe red fruit, well-integrated tannins, supple textures and good complexity. The wines were balanced, yet with vibrant profiles, a result that was more difficult to achieve in previous hot vintages.

Now, nearly 18 months later, the newly released 2022 vintage for red Burgundy is living up to its potential as a superb year for quality. Because the growing season was hot, ripeness was achieved with healthy grapes, so there are excellent wines across the board, not just at the *grand cru* level. Thus, the reds of the Côte de Beaune rival those of the Côte de Nuits and fans of red Burgundy can buy their favorite '22s with confidence, right down to the regional appellations. Best of all is the large size of the harvest, yielding more wines to go around.

Topping the charts are five 2022 reds earning an exceptional 98 points, all from the Côte de Nuits. The Domaine des Lambrays Clos des Lambrays (98 points, \$825) showcases the vintage beautifully. Though well-marked by new oak, this intense, powerful red is silky and elegant, with ripe cherry, blackberry, violet, sandalwood and mineral flavors, showing its full potential and pedigree on the long, detailed aftertaste.

"For us in particular at Domaine des Lambrays, 2022 is a milestone vintage we will remember, because it is the first one vinified in our new winery," says winemaker Jacques Devauges. "It means it has been fermented in wooden tanks with great temperature control, and more importantly, vinified 100 percent by gravity—from the grapes to the final bottle—thanks to a special gravity system we developed."

Devauges adds that 2022 was also the first year of organic certification for the Clos des Lambrays vineyard, after a four-year conversion to organic farming that he says brings better life to the soils, better quality grapes and more accuracy and precision in the wine.

A pair from Louis Jadot also attests to the greatness of the vintage. The Chambertin-Clos de Bèze Domaine Louis Jadot (98, \$800) displays beautiful balance, with focused notes of cherry, currant, sandalwood, tobacco and stone, while the Echézeaux Famille Gagey (98, \$460), packed with tension and energy, exhibits strawberry, cherry, rose hip, mineral and spice flavors, backed by a dense, resonant texture.

"2022 is really a great vintage, very well-balanced, with a moderate level of ripeness and good acidity both for whites and reds," explains Jadot technical director Frédéric Barnier. "It's clearly a good surprise when you are looking at a season which was so dry."

This group of elite 2022 reds is rounded out by the Louis Latour Romanée St.-Vivant Les Quatre Journaux (98, \$1,250), with saturated black cherry, black currant, violet, graphite, sandalwood and oak spice notes fused to an ironclad frame, and the Robert Groffier Chambolle-Musigny Les Amoureuses La Délicatesse des Sables (98, \$1,650), the only non–grand cru at the top level, offering a silky, airy and effortless profile.

Since my previous report on red Burgundy ("Pure Burgundies," May 31, 2024), I have reviewed nearly 425 wines in blind tastings at our New York office, the vast majority of them from the 2022 harvest. (The remainder comprise a handful of early release 2023s, 2021s and late-release 2020s.) An impressive 18 percent of the 2022s earn classic ratings of 95 points or higher on *Wine Spectator's* 100-point scale, while an additional 65 percent score in the outstanding range of 90 to 94 points. Based on the overall quality and success from north to south, the vintage earns a rating of 98 points for the Côte de Nuits and 96 points for the Côte de Beaune.

Just behind the top-scorers, nearly a dozen more 2022s weigh in at 97 points, including Henri Gouges' linear and almost seamless Nuits-St.-Georges Les Vaucrains (97, \$260) and Louis Jadot's mineral-infused Chambolle-Musigny Les Amoureuses Domaine Louis Jadot 2022 (97, \$640), offering the weight and feel of a grand cru.

What makes the 2022 vintage so special is the high caliber of wines from the Côte de Beaune. Not surprisingly, many are from the only *grand cru* appellation for red wines in the region: Corton. Domaine Faiveley's Corton Clos des Cortons Faiveley (97, \$485) and Louis Latour's Corton Château Corton Grancey (97, \$240) are prime examples.

"I think the Corton Clos des Cortons is the real winner of that vintage," says Domaine Faiveley co-proprietor Erwan Faiveley. "And yes, overall the Côte de Beaune reds are exceptional, equal or above the Côte de Nuits. Rare enough to be noticed."

There are other standouts up and down the Côte de Beaune, including Domaine Clos de la Chapelle's stylish and perfumed Volnay Clos de la Chapelle (95, \$150) and Lucien Le Moine's Volnay Santenots (95, \$190), featuring smoky blackberry, black currant and violet flavors.


Boasting a large number of *premiers crus* holdings, Beaune often falls under the radar—but not in 2022. Joseph Drouhin's pure, velvety Beaune Clos des Mouches (95, \$219); Louis Jadot's Beaune Clos des Ursules Héritiers Louis Jadot (95, \$115), bursting with energy and tension; Xavier Monnot's Beaune Les Cent-Vignes (95, \$110), showing intense aromas of graphite, violet, raspberry and cherry; and Tollot-Beaut's vibrant, mineral-infused Beaune Grèves (95, \$120) are all impressive versions, as well as relative values, from vineyards flanking Burgundy's de facto capital.

A look at the prices for current releases shows how expensive the top red Burgundies have become. There are more than three dozen wines in this year's report costing \$500 or more, while nearly 20 percent of the total number cost more than \$250. Even at the regional level, prices have increased. Nevertheless, there are values to be had from Bourgogne and some *village* appellations, including the Côte Chalonnaise, where outstanding versions can be found in the \$30 to \$50 range.

Among Bourgogne bottlings, Domaine Michel Magnien's silky-textured Bourgogne Côte d'Or 2022 (92, \$45), Pierre Gelin's rich Bourgogne Côte d'Or 2023 (91, \$40), Tollot-Beaut's juicy Bourgogne Côte d'Or 2022 (91, \$45), Albert Bichot's vibrant Bourgogne Secret de Famille 2022 (90, \$42) and Xavier Monnot's elegant Bourgogne 2022 (90, \$40) are all worth tracking down.

Other Côte d'Or reds to seek out include the Arnoux Père & Fils Chorey-lès-Beaune 2023 (91, \$50), a rich and luscious style; the Louis Jadot Pernand-Vergelesses Clos de la Croix de Pierre Domaine des Héritiers 2022 (91, \$60), showing strawberry, cherry, rose and stony mineral notes; and the Louis Latour Marsannay 2022 (90, \$40), infused with black fruit flavors.

Elsewhere, the Côte Chalonnaise remains a good area to explore for bargains. Mercurey, in particular, is a stronghold for reds, though its best examples have climbed north of \$50—even \$75 in some cases. Two standouts with reasonable price tags—one from Mercurey, the other from Givry—are Maison Chanzy's Mercurey Les Bussières 2023 (92, \$42) and Domaine Besson's Givry Le Haut Colombier 2022 (92, \$40).

The 2022 vintage began with a relatively dry and warm winter, leading to an early budbreak at the end of March. Once again, the threat of frost damage loomed in early April, yet unlike the preceding growing season, the buds were relatively unscathed.

One of the significant factors shaping the 2022 vintage was a big storm at the end of June, with nearly 8 inches of rain. The timing was ideal: The vines had already completed flowering, and July and August were among the hottest and driest months on record. The rain refreshed groundwater reserves, allowing the vines to develop through the summer, with drought stress mainly affecting young vines and well-drained soils.

"In 2022, the challenge was to farm with so little water between January to August," says Louis Jadot's Barnier. "The vintage was saved by some rains at the end of June. Without that, no vintage 2022."

Once again, picking began in August and was mainly completed by mid-September. The grapes were healthy, with small berries and thick skins. Most growers and houses reported excellent phenolic ripeness, an assertion reflected in the color and balance of the finished wines. Many producers also note that the vines were very resilient in 2022, having adapted to the warmer, drier conditions the region has seen since 2003.

For fans of red Burgundy, there is a lot to like about the 2022 vintage. Packed with fruit, the wines are vibrant, balanced and expressive. The only downside is the prices. But if your favorite wines are in the budget, it's hard to go wrong with these exceptional reds.

**WS Review:** A spicy version, with floral, mineral and vegetal notes framing cherry and raspberry fruit. Silky and round, with excellent balance.
